About the Carbon Disclosure Project (CDP)

CDP requests information on greenhouse gas emissions and energy use from thousands of the world's largest companies.

CDP works with 655 institutional investors holding US\$78 trillion in assets to help reveal the risks from climate change and water management in their investment portfolios.

Some 50 purchasing organizations such as Dell, PepsiCo and Walmart are using the global CDP system to mitigate environmental risks in their supply chains.
